Install the Speakers (42EP25BAT/42HP25BAT/42EP25SAT/42HP25SAT)

- 1 Face the PDP screen upside down on a clean blanket or a bracket and payattention not to indent the casing. (See figure), lay the two speaker aside of the PDP.
- $2\,$ Insert the pothook to the faucet of the PDP screen .
- 3 Fix the speaker to the PDP with the screws 4-ST 4X16 .




 $2\,$ Before turning on the PDP, ensure you have connected the line between the speaker and the PDP.

Connect the speaker to the speaker terminal of plasma screen:


Press the speaker terminal and insert the connecting cable into the terminal slot.

Release the speaker terminal and ensure that the white connecting cable is inserted in the terminal slot marked red and black connecting cable is inserted in the black terminal slot, and that anode and cathode poles are correctly connected. (See Figure)



Install the Stand

Insert the supporting bracket with 8 M4x12 screws to the installation holes on the bottom of the soleplate. Fasten the Supporting bracket and the Soleplate as shown in figure.




Install the Stand to the PDP

Face the PDP screen upside down on a clean blanket or the bracket and pay attention not to indent the casing.

Lay down the stand and put it to responding position of the PDP screen, and make sure the brace pole towards the hole of the PDP.

Fix 2 PDP brace pole to the PDP on the back of the plasma display with 4 M5X16 screws.



Installation Instructions

- The TV can be installed in various ways such as on a wall, or on a desktop etc.
- The TV is designed to be mounted horizontally.


GROUNDING


Ensure that you connect the earth ground wire to prevent possible electric shock. If grounding methods are not possible, have a qualified electrician install a separate circuit breaker. Do not try to ground the unit by connecting it to telephonewires, lightening rods, or gas pipes.

External Equipment Connections

Antenna Connection

Generally speaking, to enjoy a clearer picture, we recommend that you use a CATV system or an outdoor antenna. In different places, the suitable antenna type and position are different.





- To improve the picture quality in a poor signal area, please purchase a signal amplifier and install properly.
- If the antenna needs to be split for two TV`s, install a "2-Way Signal Splitter" in the connections.
- If the antenna is not installed properly, contact your dealer for assistance.

NOTE: All cables shown are not included with the TV.

Choose Your Connection

There are several ways to connect your television, depending on the components you want to connect and the quality of the signal you want to achieve. The following are examples of some ways to connect your TV. Choose the connection which is best for you.

VCR connection

- To avoid picture noise (interference), leave an adequate distance between the VCR and TV

Connection Option 1

Set VCR output switch to channel 3 or 4 and then tune the TV to the same channel number.


Connection Option 2

1. Connect the audio and video cables from the VCR's output jacks to the TV input jacks, as shown in the figure.

When connecting the TV to VCR, match the jack colors (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red).

If you connect an S-VÍDEO output from VCR to the S-VIDEO input, the picture quality is improved; compared to connecting a regular VCR to the Video input.

- 2. Insert a video tape into the VCR and press PLAY on the VCR. (Refer to the VCR owner's manual.)
- 3. Select the input source with using the INPUT button on the remote control, and then press ▲ / ▼ button to select the source, press the ▶ button to confirm.




External A/V Source Setup

How to connect

Connect the audio and video cables from the external equipment's output jacks to the TV input jacks, as shown in the figure. When connecting the TV to external equipment, match the jack colors (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red).

How to use

- 1. Select the input source with using the INPUT button on the remote control.
- 2. Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select the desired source.
- 3. Press theok button to confirm
- 2. Operate the corresponding external equipment.



DVD connection

How to connect

1. Connect the DVD video outputs (Y, Pb/Cb, Pr/Cr) to the Y, Pb, Pr jacks on the TV and connect the DVD audio outputs to the YPbPr Audio IN jacks on the TV, as shown in the figure.

2. If your DVD only has an S-VIDEO output jack, connect this to the S-VIDEO input on the TV. as shown in the figure.

NOTE: If your DVD player does not have component video output, use S-Video.


How to use

- 1. Turn on the DVD player, inserta DVD.
- Use the INPUT button on the remote control to select YPbPr mode.
- 3. Press Playbutton on external equipment for programplay.
- 4. Refer to the DVD player's manual for operating instructions.

DTV connection

- This TV can receive Digital Over-the-air/Cable signals without an external digital set-top box. However, if you do receive Digital signals from a digital set-top box or other digital external device, refer to the figure as shown below.
- This TV supports HDCP (High-bandwidth Digital Contents Protection) protocol for Digital Contents (480p,720p,1080i).


How to connect

Use the TV's (Y, PB, PR), VGAor HDMI jack for video connections, depending on your set-top box connector. Then, make the corresponding audio connections.

How to use

Turn on the digital set-top box. (Refer to the owner's manual for the digital set-top box.)
 Use INPUT on the remote control to select YPbPr, VGA, or HDMI source.

Digital Audio Output

Send the TV's audio to external audio equipment (stereo system) via the Digital Audio Output (Optical) port.

How to connect


- 1. Connect one end of an optical cable to the TV Digital Audio (Optical) Output port.
- 2. Connect the other end of the optical cable to the digital audio (optical) input on the audio equipment.

See the external audio equipment instruction manual for operation.

Note: When connecting with external audio equipments, such as amplifers or speakers, please turn the TV speakers off.

Caution: Do not look into the optical output port.

Looking at the laser beam may damage your vision.



PC connection

How to connect

- 1. To get the best picture quality, adjust the PC graphics cardto (1024x768).
- 2. Use the TV's PCor DVI (Digital Visual Interface) Audio IN port for video connections, depending on your PC connector.
- If the graphiccard on the PC does not output an alog and digital RGB simultaneously, connect only one of either VGAIN or DVI INto display the PC on the TV.
- If the graphic card on the PC does output analog and digital RGB simultaneously, set the TV to either VGA or DVI; (the other mode is set to Plugand Play automatically by the TV.)
- 3. Then make the corresponding audio connection. If using a soundcard, adjust the PC sound as required.

How to use


- 1. Turnon the PCand the TV.
- 2. Turnon the displayby pressing the POWER button on the TV's remote control.
- 3. Use INPUT on the remote control to select VGA or HDMI source.
- **4**. Check theimage on yourTV. There may be noise associated with the resolution, vertical pattern, contrastor brightness inPC mode. If noise is present, change the PC mode to another resolution, change the refresh rate to another rate or adjust the brightness and contrast on the menu until the picture is clear. If the refresh rate of the PC graphic card can not be changed, change the PC graphic card or consult the manufacturer of the PC graphic card.

Monitor Out Setup


The TV has a special signal output capability which allows you to hook up a second TV or monitor.

When connecting with external audio equipments, such as amplifers or speakers, please turn the TV speakers off.

- This TV can receive the High-Definition Multimedia Interface(HDMI) or the Digital Visual Interface(DVI).
- This TV supports HDCP(High-bandwidth Digital Contents Protection) Protocol for 720x480p, 1280x720p, and 1920x1080iresolution.
- When you connect this TV with a source device (DVD player, Set Top Box or PC) supporting Auto HDMI/DVI function, the output resolution of the source device will be automatically set to 1280x720p.
- If the source device does not support Auto HDMI/DVI, you need to set the output resolution appropriately.

Toget the best picture quality, adjust the DVD Player or SetTopBox's output resolution to 1280x720p, and the PC graphics card's output resolution to 1024x768, 60Hz.

- If the source device has an HDMI output, no other audio connection is necessary because HDMI-to-HDMI connection includes both video and audio.
- If the source device has a DVI output and no HDMI output, a separated audio connection is necessary.

<When the source device(DVD player or Set Top Box) supports HDMI>

How To Connect

- 1. Connect the source device to HDMI port of this TV with an HDMI cable (not supplied with this product).
- 2. No separated audio connection is necessary.

How To Use

- If the source device supports Auto HDMI function, the output resolution of the source device will be automatically set to 1280x720p.
- If the source device does not support Auto HDMI, you need to set the output resolution appropriately.

Toget the best picture quality, adjust the output resolution of the source device to 1280x720p.

- Select HDMI input source in input source option of Select Main source menu.

<When the source device(DVD player or Set TopBox) supports DVI>

How To Connect

- 1. Connect the source device to HDMI port of this TV with a HDMI-to-DVI cable (not supplied with this product).
- 2. Aseparated audio connection is necessary.
- 3.If the source device has an analog audio output connector, connect the source device audio output to DVI Audio In port located on the left side of HDMI port.





Connecting Headphones

You can connect a set of headphones to your set if you wish to watch a TV programme without disturbing the other people in the room.




Plug a set of headphones into the 3.5mm mini-jack socket on the rear panel of the set.

Note:

- Prolonged use ofheadphones at a high volume may damage your hearing.
- You will not receive sound from the speakers when you connect headphones to the system.

Power source



TO USE AC POWER SOURCE

Use the AC polarized line cord provided for operation on AC. Insert the AC cord plug into a standard polarized AC outlet.

NOTES:

- Never connect the AC line cord plug to other than the specified voltage. Use the attached power cord only.
- If the polarized AC cord does not fit into a nonpolarized AC outlet, do not attempt to file or cut the blade. It is the user`s responsibility to have an electrician replace the obsolete outlet.
- If you cause a static discharge when touching the unit and the unit fails to function, simply unplug the unit from the AC outlet and plug it back in. The unit should return to normal operation.

Operation

- -In the manual, the OSD (on screen display) may be different from your TV's, because it is just an example to help you with the TV operation.
- -There are several options you might need to set up in order for your TV to work properly. Read the instructions that follow.

Switching On/Off the TV set


- 1. First, connect power cord correctly.
- 2. Select the viewing source by using INPUT button on the remote control.
- 3. When finished using the TV, press the **POWER** button on the remote control. The TV reverts to standby mode.
- 4. If you intend to be away on vacation, disconnect the power plug from the wall power outlet.

Note:

If the TV in power on, the screen show information according the type of input signal, the information will disappear. If there is no signal and bluescreen in ON the screen enter in bluescreen and display "No signal" on top and center of the screen.

Choose the Menu Language

When you start using your set for the first time, you must select the language which will be used for displaying menus and indications.




- 1 Press the MENU button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Function menu.
- 2 Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Menu Language.
- 3 Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to enter the list of available language. (English, Spanish or French)
- **4** Select your language with the **△** / **▼** button and press the **OK** button to confirm you selection.
- **5** When you are satisfied with your choice, press the **EXIT** button to return to normal viewing or press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu.

Choose the Input source

- Change the picture source so you can watch your TV, cable TV, VCR, DVD, or any other devices that are connected to your TV.
- 1. Press the **INPUT** button to enter the Select Main picture Source menu and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the desired items. (Cable TV, VIDEO1, VIDEO2, SVIDEO, YPBPR, VGA, HDMI.)
- 2. Press the OK button to confirm.
- 3. Press INPUT button to return to TV viewing or press EXIT button to return to the previous menu.

Note:

- 1. According to your connection device, you can change the name of every source.
- 2. In channel menu, if the Tuner item is set ting as Air or Cable, the source menu will display Air TV or Cable TV.



Channel menu


- ■This TV set has three methods to set channels, which are respectively Auto Scan, manual Scan、fine tune.
- In this section, how to use the remote control to set channel is explained. You can also use buttons on the TV set to set channel.
- A password is required to gain access to Channel menu if the Lock of Edit program menu is turned on.


Automatic Scan

- Automatically finds all channels available through antenna or cable inputs, and stores them in memory on the All Channel List.

Note: the Channel menu will be only operated in normal TV mode.

- 1 Press the MENU button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
- 2 Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Tuner.
- **3** Press the \triangleright button and then use \triangle / ∇ button to Select **Cable** or **Air** mode.
- 4 Press the OK button
- **5** When you are satisfied with your choice, press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu.
- 6 Press the ▲/▼ button to select Auto Scan.
- 7 Press the ▶ button and press the OK button to start searching.
- 8 To cancel searching, press the OK button.





When **Air** is selected, the TV will detect antenna signals and will search for antenna TV (NTSC and ATSC) channels available in your local area.

When **Cable** is selected, the TV will detect cable company supplied signals and will search for cable TV (NTSC,ATSC, QAM modulated) channels available in your area.





- 1 Press the MENU button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
- 2 Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Tuner.
- 3 Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to Select Cable or Air mode.
- 4 Press the OK button.
- **5** When you are satisfied with your choice, press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu.
- 6 Press the ▲/▼ button to select Manual Scan.
- 7 Press the ▶ button and then use digital buttons to select channel number you want to add or delete.
- 8 Press the ▼ button to select OK item and press OK button to add or delete for the channel number.
- 9 Press EXIT button to return to TV viewing or press MENU button to return to the previous menu.

Fine Tune (only in anolog signal)

- 1 Press the MENU button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
- 2 Press the ▲/▼ button to select Fine Tune.
- 3 Press the ▶or OK button
- 4 Press the ◀/ ▶ button to tune.
- **5** Press **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing or press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu.



Select Off/Weak/Medium /Strong according to the image noise.

■ Color temperature

This will increase or decrease $\bf Warm$ (red) and $\bf Cold$ (blue) colors to suit personal preferences.

Select **Cold** to give the white colors a blue tint, **Standard** to give the white colors a neutral tint, **Warm** to give the white colors a red tint.



Note:

Only when the item of mode is custom, the Contrast. Brightness. Tint. color. Sharpness can be set by user. In other mode the value of them are preset by program.

Aspect Ratio Control

- Lets you choose the way an analog picture with a 4:3 aspect ratio is displayed on your TV with a 16:9 ratio picture format.
- Note: If a fixed image is displayed on the screen for along time, it image may become imprinted on the screen and remain visible.
- 1 Press the ARC button the Aspect Ratio menu appearance on the screen.

■ 4:3 mode

Choose 4:3 when you want to view a picture with an original 4:3 aspect ratio, with gray bars appearing at both the left and right sides.

Zoom 1

■ Subtitle

Choose Subtitle when you want to adjust the picture in a non-linear proportion, that is, more enlarged at top sides and no alteration, at bottom side.

■ PANORAMA

Choose PANORAMA when you want to enlarge the picture in correct proportion.

Note: When enlarging or reducing the picture size, the image may become distorted.

Closed Captions


Closed captioning is a process which converts the audio portion of a television program into written words which then appear as subtitles on the television screen. Closed captions allow viewers to read the dialogue and narration of television programs.

Using Closed Captions

Captions are the subtitles of the dialogue and narration of television programs. For prerecorded programs, program dialogue can be arranged into captions in advance. Its possible to caption a live program by using a process called real-time captioning, which creates captions instantly. Real-time captioning is normally done by professional reporters using a machine shorthand system and computer for translation into English. Captioning is an effective system for the hearing-impaired, and it can also aid in teaching language skills.

CC mode

- Press the MENU button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Function menu.
- 2. Press the ▲/▼ button to select the CC mode.
- 3. Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the items: (On, Off or On When mute.)
- 4. When you are satisfied with your choice, press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.



Note: The captions do not always use correct spelling and grammar. Not all TV programs and product commercials are made for broadcast with Closed Caption information included. Refer to your area's TV program listings for the TV channels and times of Closed Caption shows. The captioned programs are usually noted in the TV listings with service marks such as "CC".

NTSC Caption

This allows you to configure the way you choose to view the digital captioning.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the **Function** menu.
- 2. Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select NTSC Caption.
- 3. Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select caption: CC1, CC2, CC3, CC4, Text1, Text2, Text3, or Text4.

■ CAPTION

The term for the words that scroll across the bottom of the TV screen; usually the audio portion of the program provided for the hearing impaired.

■ TEXT

The term for the words that appear in a large black frame and almost cover the entire screen; usually messages provided by the broadcaster.


DTV Caption(In DTV mode)

This allows you to configure the way you choose to view the digital captioning.

Select one of the digital service channels made available by the caption provider.

There are 6 standard services. Service 1 is designated as the Primary Caption Service. This service contains the verbatim, or near-verbatim captions for the primary language being spoken in the accompanying program audio.

Service 2 is designated as the Secondary Language Service. This service contains captions in a secondary language which are translations of the captions in the primary Caption Service. The other service subchannels are not pre-assigned. It is up to the discretion of the individual caption provider to utilize the remaining service channels.






