


Installing Batteries

Insert the eye-bolts (or TV brackets and bolts) to tighten the product to the wall as shown in the picture.

Match the height of the bracket that is mounted on the wall to the holes in the product. Ensure the eye-bolts or brackets are tightened securely.



If the antenna needs to be split for two TV's, install a 2-Way Signal Splitter.

If the antenna is not installed properly, contact your dealer for assistance.

HD RECEIVER SETUP

WATCHING TV

TURNING ON THE TV

 First, connect power cord correctly. At this moment, the TV switches to standby mode.
 In standby mode to turn TV on, press the *\O*/1, INPUT, CH (▲ or ▼) button on the TV or press the POWER, INPUT, TV INPUT, CH(▲ or ▼), Number (0~9) button on the remote control.
 Select the viewing source by using the TV INPUT, INPUT button on the remote control.
 This TV is programmed to remember which power state it was last set to, even if the power cord is out.

When finished using the TV, press the **POWER** button on the remote control. The TV reverts to standby mode.


