# Important safeguards for you and your new TV

Observing the simple precautions discussed in this booklet will provide you with many years of enjoyment and safe operation. This product complies with all applicable U.S. Federal safety requirements, and those of the Canadian Standards Association.

#### 1. Read & Follow Instructions

All safety and operating instructions should be read and followed before the TV is operated.

#### 2. Retain Instructions

The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

### 3. Heed Warnings

All warnings on the TV and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.

### 4. Cleaning

Unplug the TV from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a soft and slightly damp cloth for cleaning.

#### 5. Water and Moisture

Do not use this TV near water, for example, near a bathtub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool.

#### 6. Accessories Carts and Stands

Do not place this TV on a slippery or tilted surface, or on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The TV may slide or fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the TV.

# 7. Transporting the Television

A TV and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the TV and cart combination to overturn.

#### 8. Ventilation

Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation and to ensure reliable operation of the TV and to protect it from overheating, and these openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the TV on a bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface. The TV should not be placed in a built-in installation such as a bookcase or rack unless proper ventilation is provided.

#### 9. Power Sources

This TV should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your electronics retailer or local power company.

#### 10. Power-Cord Protection

Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the TV.


# 11. Lightning

For added protection for the TV during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the TV from lightning and power-line surges.

#### 12. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the TV be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code (U.S.A.), ANSI/ NFPA 70 provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

#### 13. Power Lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall on to power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

#### 14. Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

# 15. Object and Liquid Entry

Never push objects of any kind into this TV through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short-out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on or inside the TV.

#### 16. Servicing

Do not attempt to service this TV yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

#### 17. Damage Requiring Service

Unplug from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

- **a.** If the power-supply cord or plug is damaged.
- **b.** If liquid has been spilled, or objects have fallen into the product.
- **c.** If the TV has been exposed to rain or water.
- **d.** If the TV does not operate normally by following the operating instructions. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions as an improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the product to its normal operation.
- e. If the TV has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged.
- **f.** If the TV exhibits a distinct change in performance.

#### 18. Replacement Parts

When replacement parts are required, be sure that only an authorized service technician has used replacement parts specified by Apex Digital or have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, or other hazards and void any warranty.

### 19. Safety Check

Upon completion of any service or repairs to this TV, ask the service technician to perform safety checks to determine whether the product is in proper operating condition.

### 20. Wall Mounting

The TV should be mounted to a wall only by a professional. The TV may slide or fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the product. Warranty shall be voided.

#### 21. Heat

The TV should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other products (including) amplifiers) that produce heat.





# Your remote control handset is powered by two (2) AAA type batteries



• To insert batteries, turn the remote control over and remove the battery cover.




• Place two (2) AAA batteries into the compartment with correct polarity.



• Replace the cover.

- When pointed towards the television, range is up to 16 feet from the front of the IR receiver, 30° to the left and right, 20° up and down.
- To avoid damage from possible battery chemical leakage, remove the batteries if you do
  not plan to use the remote control handset for an extended period of time. Do not mix batteries of different age and/or type. Always discard used batteries safely.
- Do not expose remote control to liquids, direct sunlight or sources of excessive heat.
- The IR receiver will not work properly if TV is in direct sunlight, the remote control is pointed off-axis or an object is in the IR path.





# **Functions Using the Remote Control Handset**

- 1. Power Turn the LCD display ON or OFF (Standby).
- 2. **Display** Provides program information currently viewed.
- **3. TV** Direct access to the television tuner.
- **4. HDMI** Press repeatedly to select HDMI 1, HDMI 2, HDMI 3.
- **5. COMP** Press repeatedly to select Component .
- **6. AV** Press repeatly to select AV.
- 7. VGA Direct access to the VGA (PC) input; press again to return to the previously viewed input.
- **8. CH LIST** Press to display a list of channels saved in the TV tuner memory.
- **9. Guide** Press to review scheduled programming for the current channel viewed.
- **10. FAV** Press to display a list of favorite TV channels you have added. (pg. 20)
- 11. Freeze Pause and still-frame the current image on the display. Press again for live TV.
- 12. Picture Select preset picture modes: Dynamic > Standard > Movie > Power Saving > Personal. (pg. 18)
- **13. Temp** Select the Color Temperature COOL > NORMAL > WARM. (pg. 18)
- **14.** ▼▲◀ ▶Arrows/ Enter Navigate menus to make selections. Press ENTER to confirm.
- 15. Exit Press to exit a menu that is displayed.
- **16. Return** Press to return to the previous menu displayed.
- **17. Sleep** Press to activate the Sleep function to turn off the TV automatically; 5 Min > 10 Min > 15 Min > 30 Min > 45 Min > 60 Min > 90 Min > 120 Min > 180 Min > 240 Min > OFF.
- **18. Menu** Press to display the Main menu.
- **19. Zoom** Select viewable display options: Normal > Wide > Zoom > Cinema.
- **20. Volume (+/-)** Adjust volume up (+) or volume down (-).
- **21. Last** Press to select between the current and previously viewed TV channel.
- **22. Mute** Press to temporarily turn sound off. Press again to resume.
- **23. Channel** ▲ / ▼ scan channels up (▲) or channels down (▼). Also use numerical keypad to select channel.
- **24. Numbers** / **Dash** Select desired TV channel directly. For example: to select digital channel four, press "4" "-" "1" (4-1).
- **25. Input** Press to display all input sources on screen. (pgs. 9-14)
- **26. Audio** Select preset sound modes: PERSONAL > STANDARD > MUSIC > MOVIE (pg. 19)
- **27.** MTS Press to select a program's second audio channel (if available). (pg. 19)
- 28. CCD Select closed caption subtitles (if available) OFF > ON. (pg. 22)



NOTE: When using the remote control, point it directly at the TV.



**1. Input** - After connecting your DVD, cable box, etc., select the appropriate input source to view. Press the INPUT button to display input options. Press **CH+** / **CH-** buttons to highlight an input. Press **VOL+** to select.




- **2. Menu** Press the MENU button to display the menu screen. Press **VOL+** to highlight a menu. Press **CH+** / **CH-** to highlight a feature within the menu then press **VOL+** to adjust setting.
- **3. Channel (CH+ / CH-)** Press the **CH+ / CH-** buttons to scan TV channels up or down.
- **4. Volume (VOL+ / VOL-)** Press the **VOL+ / VOL-** buttons to adjust volume up or down.
- **5. Power** Press the POWER button to turn the LCD display ON/ OFF (standby). When the power is on, a blue LED illuminates on the front panel. The screen image will appear within a few seconds.


### **Wall Mounting**

It is recommended that you For Wall Mounting call your local TV dealer or a licensed contractor to secure the television to the wall using suitable VESA 400 x 400mm wall mount hardware.

# Removal of TV Pedestal

To remove the pedestal from the television, lay the TV flat, unscrew the (6) Philips screws from underneath the pedestal base and slide the bracket off.





- **1. RF Input -** Connect antenna or cable for television reception.
- 2. USB Port For service technician use only.
- 3. HDMI Inputs (3) Connects to digital AV devices that feature HDMI connectivity. HDMI supports enhanced high definition video and two-channel digital audio all from one cable. Recommended for best performance.
- 4. PC IN VGA/Audio Input (3.5mm) Connect an optional VGA cable from your personal computer and a 3.5mm audio cable for sound.
- 5. Component Inputs and L/R Audio Inputs Connect up to external devices that feature component (YPbPr) video and audio output jacks.

- 6. SPDIF Connect an optional coaxial digital cable through a compatible amp/receiver to enjoy superior audio sound.
- 7. AUDIO OUT- Connect to the audio equipment.
- **8. AV Inputs -** Connect up to two external devices to the composite VIDEO (V) and AUDIO (L/R) output jacks found on most external video equipment.



- Connect optional component video cables (blue, green, red) from the video OUTPUT jacks (Y, Pb, Pr) on your external device to the Component 1 on the TV's rear panel.
- Connect white/red audio cables for sound from the audio (L/R) OUT-PUT jacks on your external device to the Component INPUT(s) on the TV's rear panel.

#### How to Use

- Press the COMP button on the remote control (repeatedly if necessary) or
- Press the INPUT button on the TV remote control. Use ▼▲ arrow buttons to highlight the input to view (Component) then press ENTER.



### **How to Connect Composite AV**

- When connecting external devices to your television, match the colors of the connecting jacks (Video: Yellow; Audio: White/Red).
- Connect the yellow video cable from the video OUTPUT jack on your external A/V equipment to AV input on the TV's rear panel.
- Connect the white/red audio cables for sound from the audio (L/R) OUTPUT
  jacks on your external A/V equipment to the AV (L/R) jacks on the TV's
  rear panel.

#### How to Use AV

- Press the AV button on the remote control (repeatedly if necessary) or
- Press the INPUT button on the remote control. Use ▼▲ arrow buttons to high-light the input to view (AV) then press ENTER.







Dolby Digital can deliver optimal 2 channel stereo or surround sound with five discrete full range channels plus a sixth channel for a subwoofer.

Enjoy optimal sound reproduction from your system with a Dolby Digital amplifier that incorporates a digital coaxial input. Connect an optional coaxial cable directly to the television's SPDIF audio output to listen through all inputs except VGA. (VGA input does not support digital audio)

# **Connecting to a Stereo** Receiver/Amplifier

Enjoy realistic sound from a stereo / receiver amplifier or Dolby Pro Logic sound system when connected to your AV equipment.

Example: Diagram illustrates the connection of audio cables from your external equipment to a stereo receiver instead of the audio (L/R) jacks on the TV's rear panel.

**NOTE:** When audio cables are connected to a stereo / receiver amplifier for a particular input, no audio sound can be heard from the TV's built-in speakers.



# **Initial Setup Wizard**

After connecting your TV antenna or cable wire, turn the television ON. The quick setup wizard will display on-screen. Select your preferred Picture setting followed by antenna options if you will view local over-the-air TV broadcasts from an antenna. Theses channels will be stored in the TV tuner memory after performing Channel Auto Scan.





It can adjust the contrast corresponding to the input

#### Film Mode

Press ▼/▲ button to select the item Film Mode, then

press **◄/▶** button to adjust. It handles 3:2 pull down and 2:2 pull down.

#### **Noise Reduction**

Press ▼/▲ button to select the item Noise Reduction,


then press **◄/▶** button to adjust.

#### **MPEG Noise Reduction**

Press ▼/▲ button to select the item MPEG Noise Reduction, then press ◀/▶ button to adjust It can improve the quality of the pictures by reducing the block noise.







The **SOUND** menu offers options to make sound enhancements while listening through the built-in speakers or to select digital audio options when connected to a Dolby Digital receiver though a (SPDIF) coaxial digital output.



### Sound Settings

- 1.Press ENTER when the Sound Settings item is high lighted. Then you will go to the submenu as following.
- 2.Press ▼/▲ to select the desired menu item. Press ENTER to proceed if necessary.
- 3.Press **◄/▶** to the desired level.
- 4. When you have changed the settings, you can exit from the menu by pressing MENU.

#### Surround Mode

Press ▼/▲ button to select the item Surround Mode, then press ENTER button to adjust. It can set the picture to fit the screen automatically. When the Auto Wide is selected, the symbol will show as following:

### AVL

Press ▼/▲ button to select the item AVL, then press ENTER button to select ON or OFF. Auto Volume Level can set the volume automatically adjust corresponding to the input audio.

## Digital Audio Output

Press ▼/▲ button to select the item Digital Audio Output, then press ◀/▶ button to select the desired digital audio output. Available digital audio output: PCM, Raw and Off .

# **Equalizer Settings**

#### **Equalizer Mode**

Press ▼/▲ button to select the item Equalizer Mode then press ◀/▶ button to select the desired mode. Available Equalizer Mode Off, Rock, Pop, Jazz, User.





Note: This menu is only shown when the input source is TV.

#### Channel List

Press ▼/▲ button to select Channel List, then press ENTER button to scan the Channel List. If you select the option "In Channel List" On, the channel label will display in the list.

#### **Favorite List**

Press ▼/▲ button to select Favorite List, then press ENTER button to scan the Favorite Channel List.

### **Channel Setting**

Press ▼/▲ button to select Manual Channel Setting then press ENTER button to set the value in the sub menu.

# Signal Type

Press ▼/▲ button to select Signal Type, then press ◄/▶ button to select the type you want to set. There are two selections: Air, Cable.

### Auto Channel Search

Press ▼/▲ button to select Auto Channel Search, then press ENTER button to search channel. A Channel Search Menu will appear as below.











In the **SETUP** menu you may change the initial set up of preferences that include settings for language, menu display, computer monitoring, closed captions, enhancement of black detail in the picture and resetting your TV back to its factory default status.



#### **Closed Caption**

Press ▼/▲ button to select the item Closed Caption, then press ◄/▶ button to adjust.

## Caption Display

Press **▼/ △** button to select Caption Display, then press **◄**/**▶** button to select ON or OFF. Analog Caption Type

Press **▼/** button to select Analog Caption Type, then press **◄/** button to select the type.




