

- 1. Read these instructions---All operating instructions must be read and understood before the product is operated.
- 2. Keep these instructions---These safety and operating instructions must be kept in a safe place for future reference.
- 3. Heed all warnings---All warnings on the product and in the instructions must be observed closely.
- **4. Follow all instructions**—All operating instructions must be followed.
- **5. Do not use this apparatus near water**—for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, and the like. Do not use immediately after moving from a low temperature to high temperature environment, as this causes condensation, which may result in fire, electric shock, or other hazards.


Apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.

# **Preparations**

### **Using the Remote Control**

■ Use the remote control by pointing it towards the remote sensor window of the set. Objects between the remote control and sensor window may prevent proper operation.

**Note**: This illustration is for reference only. The remote sensor may be in different locations on different models.


### Cautions regarding use of remote control

- Do not expose the remote control to shock. In addition, do not expose the remote control to liquids, and do not place in an area with high humidity.
- Do not install or place the remote control under direct sunlight. The heat may cause deformation of the unit.
- The remote control may not work properly if the remote sensor window of the main unit is under direct sunlight or strong lighting. In such a case, change the angle of the lighting or the LCD Monitor, or operate the remote control closer to the remote sensor window.


### **Batteries for the Remote Control**

If the remote control fails to operate the LCD Monitor functions, replace the batteries in the remote control.


1 Open the battery cover.




3 Replace the cover.



■ (Place the batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (-) indications in the battery compartment.)






### Precaution on battery use

Improper use of batteries can result in a leakage of chemicals and/or explosion. Be sure to follow the instructions below.

- Place batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (–) indications.
- Different types of batteries have different characteristics. Do not mix batteries of different types.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries can shorten the life of new batteries and/or cause old batteries to leak chemicals.
- Remove batteries as soon as they are non-operable. Chemicals that leak from batteries can cause a rash. If chemical leakage is found, wipe with a cloth.
- The batteries supplied with the product may have a shorter life expectancy due to storage conditions.
- If the remote control is not used for an extended period of time, remove the batteries from the remote control.

### **Power Connection**



- 1. Connecting the female plug to the AC socket on the unit.
- 2. Connecting the male plug to the outlet as illustrated.

- This product should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label.
- Always unplug the AC cord from power outlet when not using for a long period of time.

Press this button to access the Menu main page

To access signal source select menu


Press this button to turn the unit ON from STANDBY mode. Press it again to turn the set back to STANDBY.

6. Headphone Jack ∩

Functions of  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ , **VOL**  $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$ , **MENU**, **INPUT** and **POWER**  $\circlearrowleft$  are also provided to the remote control. This operation manual provides a description based on operating functions with the remote control.

# Identification of Controls (continued)



### 1. Speaker output jacks

Connect the speaker audio cable to the speaker output jacks on the unit matching the "+" and "-" ends of the cable by color.

- 2. HDMI1 interface
- 3. HDMI2 interface
- 4. VGA input

Connect to the VGA/audio output jacks from your computer.

**5. Component inputs** (Y, Cb/Pb, Cr/Pr, Audio R, L)

Connect to the component and audio output sockets of a DVD player or Set-Top Box.

### 6. S-VIDEO input

Receive an S-Video signal from external source such as VCR or DVD player.

7. AV inputs (Video, Audio L, R)


Receive video/audio signals from external sources such as VCR or DVD player.




### **Connections**

### **Cautions Before Connecting**

- Carefully check the terminals for position and type before making any connections.
- The illustration of the external equipment may be different depending on your model.
- Loose connectors can result in image or color problems. Make sure that all connectors are securely inserted into their terminals. Refer to the operating manual of the external device as well.
- When connecting an external device, turn the power off on the panel to avoid any issues.

### Connect a VCR



### How to connect:

Connect the Audio/Video cables between the Audio (L/R)/Video jacks on the unit and VCR.

### Note:


The Video terminal of the AV INPUT(1) and the S-Video terminal share the same audio input terminals. For better video, you can use the S-Video terminal if your source supports it.

The S-Video terminal is prior to Video terminal when they are connected at the same time. To use Video terminal, you should disconnect S-Video.

### To play VCR

- 1. Turn on your LCD monitor, press **AV1** button on the remote control.
- 2. Turn on your VCR, insert a videotape and press the Play button.

### **Connect a Camcorder**



### How to connect:

Connect the Audio/Video cables between the Audio (L/R)/Video jacks on the unit and camcorder.


### To playback Camcorder

- 1. Turn on your LCD monitor, press AV2 button on the remote control.
- 2. Turn on your camcorder and set it to output mode. (For details, refer to your camcorder owner's manual.)
- 3. Insert the tape into the camcorder and press Play button.

### Note:

The operations of the camcorder may be different and is dependent on your model. Please read the owner's manual of your camcorder to confirm operation.

### Connect a DVD player




### How to connect a DVD Player using Component Video Connections:

Connect the Video cable between the Y, Cb/Pb, Cr/Pr input jacks on the unit and Y, Cb/Pb, Cr/Pr output jacks on the DVD player . Connect the Audio cable between the AUDIO input jacks on the unit and AUDIO output jacks on the DVD player.

### To play DVD

- 1. Turn on your LCD monitor, press Comp1 button or Comp2 button on the remote control.
- 2. Turn on your DVD player.


### How to connect:

### **To Watch your Product**

- 2. Turn on your product.

### Connect a PC




### How to connect:

Connect a VGA cable between the VGA jack on the PC and the VGA input jack on the unit.

Connect an Audio cable between the AUDIO output on the PC and AUDIO input jacks on the unit.

### To Watch the PC screen

- 1. Turn on your LCD monitor, press **VGA** button on the remote control.
- 2. Turn on your PC and check for PC system requirements.
- 3. Adjust the screen resolution and settings on your computer to the preferred settings.



### How to connect:

Connect the Audio/Video cables between the Audio (L/R)/Video jacks on the unit and VCR. Or connect the Audio cable between the Audio (L/R) jacks on the unit and Audio amplifier.

### How to record program

- 1. Turn on your LCD monitor, select a program you wish to record.
- 2. Turn on your VCR, insert a videotape for recording.
- 3. Press the Record button to begin recording.

### How to enjoy high quality sound by Audio amplifier

- 1. Turn on your LCD monitor, select a program source.
- 2. Turn on your audio amplifier and adjust for a proper volume.

### Note:

- ■The AV output terminals only can output AV signal.
- ■To fully enjoy sound effects from Audio Amplifier you can enter into Audio menu and set Line Output menu item to a proper setting. For details information, please refer to page 19 **Setting the Line Output** section.

# **Turning the Unit On and Off**

### Turning the Unit On and Off

### **Turning On**

Insert the power cord into the wall outlet.

Press the **Power**  $\odot$  button on the remote control.

The unit will be turned on and you will be ready to use its features.

### **Turning Off**

With the power on, press the **Power** button on the remote control to turn off the unit


You can also use the **Power**  $\circlearrowleft$  button on the control panel on the main unit.

### Viewing the Menus and Displays

Your LCD monitor has a easy-to-use menu system that appears on the screen. This system makes it convenient and fast to use features on the unit. The unit also lets you display the status of many of your LCD monitor features.

### Viewing the Menus

- 1 With the power on, press the **MENU** button on the remote control. The main menu appears on the screen.
- 9 Use ◀ or ▶ to select menu page, use ▼ to enter the menu page.
- 3 Use the ▲ or ▼ to select menu item. Use ◀ or ▶ to adjust value of item. Use ▶ or Select button to confirm or enter submenu . You can press the MENU button repeatedly to exit the menu operations.



(The above OSD is shown as an example.)

### Note:

- 1. To clearly introduce the menu operations, this operation manual provides a description based on operation with the remote control.
- 2. In most cases the function of Select button is equal to ▶ button.

### **Displaying Status Information**

Press the **Display** button on the remote control, the unit will display current status information such as signal source etc.

### Adjusting the Volume

### Using the volume buttons (VOL+ and VOL-)

Press the VOL+ or VOL- to increase or decrease the volume.

### Using the Mute

### Using the MUTE button

At any time, you can temporarily cut off the sound using the MUTE button.

- 1 Press the **MUTE** button and the sound cuts off.
- 2 To turn sound on, press the **MUTE** button again.

# **Basic Operations**

### Selecting Input Signal

You can directly select input source by using buttons on the remote control.

Comp1 ----- Select signal from COMPONENT INPUT(1) terminals.

Comp2 ----- Select signal from COMPONENT INPUT(2) terminals.


**HDMI1**-----Select signal from HDMI1 interface.

HDMI2-----Select signal from HDMI2 interface.

AV1-----Select signal from AV INPUT(1)/S-VIDEO terminals.

AV2-----Select signal from AV INPUT(2) terminals.

VGA-----Select signal from VGA interface.





### **Editing Input Label**

- Press MENU to display the menu main page.
- Press ◆ or ▶ repeatedly to select Input Settings menu.
- 4 Press ▶ to access the submenu.
- 6 Press **Select** and then use ◀ ▶ ▲ ▼ or 0-9 number buttons to edit the Input Label. After finishing editing, press **Select** to exit editing .
  You can use **Prev CH** to switch between uppercase and lowercase.

### Selecting a Menu Language

- 1 Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- 2 Press ◆ or ▶ repeatedly to select Preferences Settings menu.
- 4 Press ▶ access the submenu.
- 5 Press ▲ or ▼ to select among English, FranÇais and Español.



### Customizing the Picture

- Press **MENU** to display the menu main page. The **Picture** menu page will be displayed automatically.
- Press ▲ or to select the item you wish to adjust.
- Press ◀ or ▶ to adjust the value of the item.



### In AV mode

Contrast	Adjusts image contrast.	<ul><li> : weaker</li><li> : stronger</li></ul>
Color	Adjusts color saturation.	▶ : deeper ◀ :paler
Tint	Adjusts tint for image.	<ul><li> : greenish</li><li> : purplish</li></ul>
Black Level	Adjusts screen brightness for easier viewing of dark picture such as night scenes.	▶ : lighter ◀ : darker
Sharpness	Adjusts image sharpness and displays a sharp image.	▶ : sharper

### Using the Preset Picture Mode

- Press **MENU** to display the menu main page. The Picture menu page will be displayed automatically.
- Press ▶ access the submenu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select a desired picture mode.

There are three preset picture modes (Soft, Normal and Bright) and one user-set picture mode (**User**). Each preset mode has its own picture settings.

**Soft**: Select for a finely detailed picture.


Normal: Select for a normal picture.

Bright: Select for a bright picture.

This item will be set to **User** automatically when you customize the picture.

You may directly use the Picture button on the remote control to select a desired

picture mode.



### Setting Auto Color Function On or Off


- 1 Press MENU to display the menu main page.
  The Picture menu page will be displayed automatically.
- 3 Press ➤ repeatedly to activate the function or not.

If you want to activate the function, please press ▶ to confirm when the item is selected, you use this function to reduce color and tint variations.



### Selecting the Preset Color Warmth Mode

- 1 Press MENU to display the menu main page.
  The Picture menu page will be displayed automatically.
- 3 Press ▶ access the submenu.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to select between Warm, Normal and Cool.



### Changing Screen Aspect Ratio

You can select the image aspect ratio by using **16:9, 4:3**, **Panorama** and **Zoom** button.

**16:9** — For 16:9 signal format. This mode expands the picture into a full 16:9 picture.

4:3 — For 4:3 signal format. This mode displays a 4:3 picture at its standard 4:3 size without any stretching.


**Panorama** — For 4:3 signal format. In this mode the picture is progressively stretched toward each side of the screen.(only for 480i and 480p signals)

**Zoom** — For 4:3 letterbox signal format. This mode stretches the picture horizontally and crops the top and bottom black bars of the picture. (only for 480i and 480p signals))

# **Setting Sound**

### Customizing the Sound

- 1 Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- Press or repeatedly to select Audio menu.
- 4 Press or repeatedly to select items you want to adjust.
- 5 Press ◆ or ▶ to adjust the value or ▶ to confirm.

### Note:

The **Headphone Volume** can only be adjusted when headphones are connected or the PIP function is activated."

### Setting the Line Output

- Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- 2 Press or ▶ repeatedly to select Audio menu.
- 4 Press ▶ to access submenu.
- 5 Press or to select a desired Line Output mode.



Variable: SP On: When this mode is selected, the sound is output from speaker and you can adjust the volume from the monitor.

**Variable: SP Off:** In this mode, the monitor is mute while the sound is output from the connected Audio Amplifier and you can adjust the volume from the monitor.

**Fixed: SP Off**: In this mode, the monitor is mute while the sound is output from connected Audio Amplifier and you cannot adjust the volume from the monitor.

Note: Be sure the external audio amplifier is connected properly.

### Using the Preset Sound Mode

- 1 Press MENU to display the menu main page.
- Press or repeatedly to select Audio menu.
- 4 Press ▶ to access submenu.
- 5 Press or to select a desired sound mode.

There are three preset sound modes (Music, Movie and News) and one


user-set sound mode (User). Each preset mode has its own sound settings (Bass and Treble).


**Music**: Select for a music program.

This item will be set to **User** automatically when you customize the sound.










The wakeup timer must be set each time you wish to use this function.



### **Displaying Signal Source Information**

This setting allows you to obtain the detailed information about the input source signal.

Poor picture	Sometimes, poor picture quality occurs when an activated S-VHS camera or camcorder is connected while another activated peripheral is connected. In this case, switch off one of the peripherals.  Check whether the room is too bright.
Horizontal dotted line	<ul><li>This may be caused by electrical interference (e.g. hairdryer, nearby neon lights, etc.).</li><li>Turn off the equipment.</li></ul>
Remote operation fails.	Check whether the batteries are working. Replace if necessary.  Clean the remote control sensor lens on the unit.  Do not use the remote control under strong or fluorescent lighting.  The batteries should be inserted with polarity (+, -) aligned.
