






Operation

- Aim the remote control at the remote sensor and press control buttons to operate.






Cable TV connections

This TV has an extended tuning range and can tune most cable channels without using a Cable TV Converter box. Some cable companies offer "premium pay channels" where the signal is scrambled. Descrambling these signals for normal viewing requires the use of a descrambler device which is generally provided by the Cable TV company.


For subscribers to basic Cable TV service



For basic Cable TV service not requiring a Converter/Descrambler box, connect the 75 ohm Coaxial Cable directly to the Antenna Jack on the back of the TV.


For subscribers to scrambled Cable TV service

If you subscribe to a Cable TV service which requires the use of a Converter/Descrambler box, connect the incoming 75 ohm Coaxial Cable to the Converter/Descrambler box. Using another 75 ohm Coaxial Cable, connect the output jack of the Converter/Descrambler box to the Antenna Jack on the TV. Follow the connections shown below. Set the TV to the output channel of the Converter/Descrambler box (usually channel 3 or 4) and use the Converter/Descrambler box to select channels.



For subscribers to unscrambled Cable TV service with scrambled premium channels

If you subscribe to a Cable TV service in which basic channels are unscrambled and premium channels require the use of a Converter/Descrambler box, you may wish to use a signal Splitter and an A/B Switch box (available from the Cable TV company or an electronics supply store). Follow the connections shown below. With the switch in the "B" position, you can directly tune any nonscrambled channels on your TV. With the switch in the "A" position, tune your TV to the output of the Converter/Descrambler box (usually channel 3 or 4) and use the Converter/Descrambler box to tune scrambled channels.



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

This is normal with Closed Captioning, especially with live programs. This is because during live programs, captions are also entered live. These transmissions do not allow time for

- When Captions are being displayed, on-screen displays, such as volume and mute may be seen but may interfere with Closed Captions
- Some cable systems and copy protection systems may interfere with the Closed Captioned signal.
- If using an indoor antenna or if TV reception is very poor, the Closed Caption Decoder may not appear or may appear with strange characters or misspelled words. In this case, adjust the antenna for better reception or use an outdoor antenna.

MP3/WMA/JPEG and Audio CD playback

This player can play back MP3/WMA/JPEG-data which has been recorded on CD-R or CD-RW. To produce MP3/WMA/ JPEG-data, you need a Windows-PC with CD-ROM drive and MP3/WMA/JPEG-encoding software (not supplied). The Apple-HFS-System cannot be played.

MP3/WMA/JPEG CD information

Limitations on MP3/WMA/JPEG CD playback

- MP3/WMA/JPEG CD is the disc that is standardized by ISO9660, its file name must include 3-digit extension letters, "mp3", "wma", "jpg".
 The directory and file names of MP3/WMA/JPEG CD must
- correspond to ISO standardized files.
- This unit can read 2046 files per directory. If one directory has more than 2046 files, it reads up to 2046 files, the remaining files will be omitted.
- MP3/WMA CDs cannot be used for playback for the purpose of recording.
- It may take more than one minute for this unit to read MP3/
- WMA/JPEG files depending on its structure. Music recorded by "Joliet Recording Specification" can be played back.
- The music files recorded by "Hierarchical File System" (HFS) cannot be played
- The unit can play back baseline and progressive JPEG files.

Notes on MP3/WMA/JPEG files

To play back MP3/WMA/JPEG CD in the recorded order,

- 1. Use MP3/WMA/JPEG software that records data alphabetically
- 2. Name each file including a two-digit or three-digit number (e.g. "01" "02" or "001" "002").
- 3. Refrain from making too many sub-folders.

CAUTION:

- Some MP3/WMA/JPEG CDs cannot be played back depending on the recording conditions.

You can enjoy a high quality picture by connecting the unit's COMPONENT VIDEO OUT jacks of your BD or DVD player with the COMPONENT video cables (not supplied).

Component Video input of the unit are for use with a device which output 480i/1080i interlaced signals and 480p/720p progressive signals.









To connect a HDMI or a DVI device to the unit

The HDMI 1 input receives digital audio and uncompressed video from a HDMI device or uncompressed digital video from a DVI device. When you connect to a DVI device with a HDMI-to-DVI adapter cable, it transfers only video signal. Separate analog audio cables are required.



Using an AV Amplifier with built-in digital surround

If you are using an Amplifier with built-in digital surround sound, you can enjoy various audio systems including Dolby Digital Surround audio that sounds just like the movie.

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

To connect an audio system

This connection allows you to use an audio amplifier and external speakers, and adjust the audio level using the TV's remote control. To control the audio, turn on the TV and the stereo amplifier, and turn off the TV's built-in speakers (see page 18).



NOTE


To hear sound when using an external audio amplifier, the volume of both the TV and the amplifier must be set above 0 (zero). For example, if the volume of the TV is set to 0, you will not be able to hear any sound, even if the volume of the amplifier is at its highest level.

To connect the TV/BD to a camcorder, or a TV Game

To play back from a camcorder, connect the camcorder to the unit as shown.

This unit can also be used as a display device for many video games. However, due to the wide variety of signals generated by these devices and subsequent hook-up variations required, they have not all been included in the suggested connection diagrams. You'll need to consult each component's Owner's Manual for additional information.




To connect the TV/BD to a PC (Personal Computer)

Before you connect this TV/BD to your PC, change the adjustment of your PC's Resolution and Refresh rate (60 Hz). Connect one end of a (male to male) VGA cable to the video card of the computer and the other end to the VGA connector PC MONITOR IN on the rear of the TV/BD. Attach the connectors firmly with the screws on the plug. In case of a Multimedia computer, connect the audio cable to the audio output of your Multimedia computer and to the AUDIO connector of the PC/DVI AUDIO IN jack of the TV/BD. You can also connect the PC with HDMI cable. If you use a HDMI cable, you don't have to connect the audio cable. If you use a DVI-to-HDMI cable, please connect the audio cable in the same way as the VGA cable.

Press INPUT on the remote control to select PC mode.

Switch on the computer. The TV/BD can operate as the computer monitor.

IGNITION NOISE:

Black spots or horizontal streaks may appear, picture may flutter or drift. Usually caused by interference from automobile ignition systems, neon lamps, electrical drills, and other electrical appliances.




CHOSTS

Ghosts are caused by the television signal following two paths. One is the direct path and the other is reflected from tall buildings, hills or some other objects. Changing the direction or position of the antenna may improve reception. Ghosting may also be caused by defects in the antenna system such as unshielded leads or connecting several sets to the same antenna without using multiple antenna couplers.



SNOW:

If your receiver is located in the fringe area of a television station where the signal is weak, your picture may be marred by the appearance of small dots. When the signal is extremely weak, it may be necessary to install a special antenna to improve the picture.



RADIO FREQUENCY INTERFERENCE:

The interference produces moving ripples or diagonal streaks, and in some cases, causes loss of contrast in the picture.



This television has been designed pursuant to the FCC class B Rules. This is to prevent a problem to Radio receivers. If this television causes a problem to Radio receivers, then take the following steps:

- Keep the television away from Radio.
- Adjust Radio antennas in order for the television not to receive interference.
- The antenna cable of Radio should be kept away from the television.
- Use a coaxial cable for antenna.

You can check if this television influences Radio receivers by turning off all other equipment other than the television. If you find a problem receiving Radio when using the television, check the instructions mentioned above.



BLOCK NOISE or FREEZE (DIGITAL INPUT):

Fuzzy blocks may appear in some area or the whole area of the screen. This is usually caused by interference from automobile ignition systems, neon lamps, electrical drills, ghosting of the image and lost or weak receiving signals.



BLACK SCREEN

When using an antenna, weak signals will display a black screen. It may be necessary to upgrade your antenna.

• The TV set can generate sound distortion in external devices such as a radio. Please separate radio equipment from the TV set to a considerable distance.


